## **There Is Hope.**

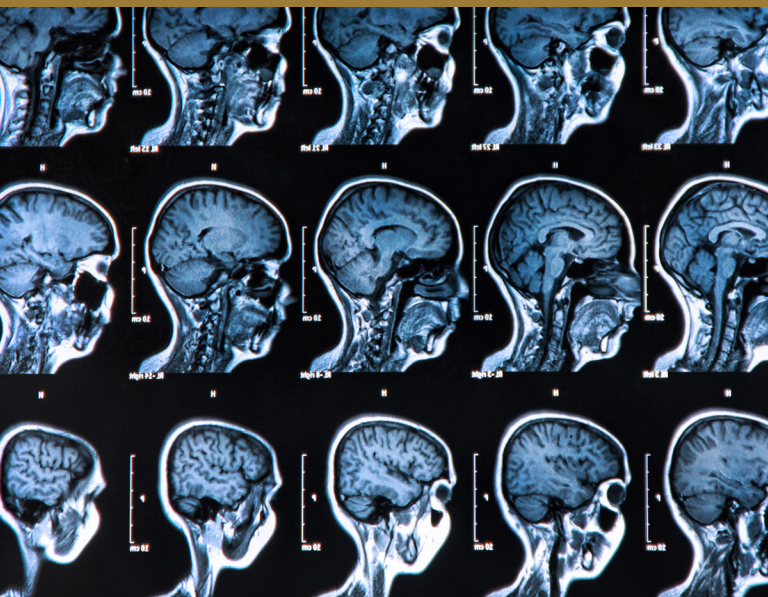
